



RESUSCITATION

Presentations may involve the evaluation and resuscitation for all ages, assessment and stabilization of trauma patients, obstetric and critical care medicine topics relevant to emergency physicians, and relevant hospice and palliative medicine topics.

Examples of specific conditions may include pneumothrax, aortic dissection, pulmonary embolism, undifferentiated respiratory failure, stroke, eclampsia, septic shock, pediatric drowning, and end-of-life care decisions.

Newborn Resuscitation

- Apnea and Bradypnea
- Bradycardia
- Persistent cyanosis

- Persistent atony
- Cardiac arrest

Pediatric Medical Resuscitation

- Severe respiratory distress
- Cyanosis
- Severe dehydration
- Hypotension
- Altered mental status (Decreased alertness, stupor, lethargy)
- Seizure
- Fever

- Cardiac arrest
- Poor tone
- Critical ingestions and exposures
- Dysrhythmia
- · Respiratory failure
- Shock
- Status epilepticus

Pediatric Trauma Assessment and Stabilization

- Multisystem trauma
- Shock
- Airway management

- Spine and spinal cord injury
- Chest trauma
 - Blunt
 - Penetrating

- Orthopedic trauma (life or limb threatening)

Obstetrics Resuscitation

- Precipitous delivery
- Difficult delivery
- Seizures

- Massive vaginal hemorrhage
- Cardiovascular crisis (amniotic fluid embolism, PE, cardiac arrest, sepsis)

Adult Cardiac Resuscitation

- Cardiac arrest
- Probable pulmonary embolism
- Electrolyte emergency
- Post-traumatic
- · Unstable cardiac rhythm

- · Acute myocardial infarction
- · Congestive heart failure
- Cardiogenic shock
- · Dysrhythmia

Adult Medical Resuscitation

- Severe respiratory distress
- Cardiac dysrhythmia
- Profound weakness
- Seizures
- Hypothermia
- Hyperthermia

- Hypotension
- Critical ingestion or exposures
- · Respiratory failure
- Shock
- Status epilepticus
